SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Correct.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Okay, and then we go to (3) (a)...

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Now, wait a minute, when you get to (f), on line 3, or line 13, page 3, that is correct, that is one separate section, correct.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Okay, and then we go to line 19 there, in number (3) (a)...

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Correct.

SENATOR LINDSAY: ... is that one separate? And then (b, (c), (d), (e), (f), are each one separate?

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Correct.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Okay. And then we go on to page 5. Is that correct?

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: We have on line 19, page 4...

SENATOR LINDSAY: Okay.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: I think (f), if I remember correctly, line 17, on page 4, goes to page (sic) 1 of page 5. And Patrick and the Lieutenant Governor are nodding their heads, so from 19 on page 4, "The counselor shall sign and date a form" goes to...then to the beginning...or the end of line 1, page 5, and then you have the rest.

SENATOP LINDSAY: Okay, and then sections (3) and (4) would be separate?

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: No.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Section ...

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Lines 2 to 7 are all in one.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Okay. Thank you, Senator. I hate being put in this position that we have to judge between the integrity of the body which is certainly at issue here as far as the right of
