SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you, Senator. Thank you, Senator, you're on my time. I recall shortly, oh, I would say at least 20 to 30 minutes ago, you made the statement on the floor that shocked me and that you said you support LB 769, that you support parental notification, and I cannot understand why, at this point in the morning, you are doing what you're doing. And I am going to oppose the bracket motion, of course, and hope that we will come to a vote on the rule suspension, and you can come in on Select File with your entire amendment and I hope with an explanation of each section, as I have done.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Baack, you're the first of 14 speakers, Senator Landis, second, and Senator Hall. Senator Baack.

SENATOR BAACK: Yes, I would yield my time to Senator Bernard-Stevens.

PRESIDENT: Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Senator Baack. Senator Labedz, first of all, I favor the bracket motion because I don't think we can adequately discuss what I have put before you in the time remaining. And maybe within two days people will be able to have a chance to look at what is before them and we may come up with some surprising answers. We may, in fact, find that a majority of those people supporting 769 like the amendments. Don't throw out that possibility. A majority of you may, in fact, like the amendments. To be quite honest with the body, there are many ways to use parliamentary procedure. I have learned from some of the masters, Senator Schmit, to be one; Senator Labedz, to be two; certainly Senator Chambers, and others in the body. Over the years, they are tremendous teachers of the rules. But I would like to also mention to members of the body that I could have gone another way. In fact, my choices were to go this way and do this to you on Select File, which I could have done because my amendment that was filed would be before any suspension motion, or I could offer it on General File and do it this way. I might also add to the body that the rules also imply, whether you like it or not, that if you support Senator Labedz's motion to overrule the
