But 33 senators voted to overrule the Chair. My motion now...Senator Bernard-Stevens' motion is now to overrule the Chair and I'm sure that he will have the opportunity to bring that to a vote. I would like to ask Senator Barrett, our Speaker, a question, if I may.

PRESIDENT: Is Senator Barrett in the room? Don't see him at the moment, Senator Labedz.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Well, perhaps when he gets to the floor I will be able to ask him the question.

PRESIDENT: All right.

SENATOR LABEDZ: I think we're voting now on whether or not, on Senator Bernard-Stevens' motion, to overrule the Chair. I'll be speaking on the amendments as they....And the way I understand it, and I want the rest of the body to understand it, if the Chair is overruled, then we go on with the division of the question. If the Chair is upheld, then we go to Senator Bernard-Stevens' amendment? Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator McFarland, please.

SENATOR McFARLAND: I'd just respectfully call the question, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. That won't be necessary, you're the last speaker on the agenda. Senator Bernard-Stevens, would you like to close on your motion, please.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Senator Smith asked if I would explain, is this the same amendment. And actually I guess I would...I'm a little confused at this point. We haven't really gotten to the amendment discussion at all. But it's the amendment that I substituted yesterday. And the discussion then has been central, at some point, would I be able to divide that amendment into sections. And that has been the discussion so far, and we really haven't gotten...so there are no other...that's the amendment that is before us now. I was in a discussion...is this closing, Mr. President?

PRESIDENT: Yes, sir, it is.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: I don't really have too much more to
