

PRESIDENT: Senator Peterson, please record your presence. Thank you. We're now looking for Senator Goodrich. Sergeant-at-Arms advises me they are unable to locate Senator Goodrich at the moment. Senator Bernard-Stevens, do you want to go ahead without Senator Goodrich, or do you wish to wait?
