

no, he could not promise me that. And I appreciate the fact that he is truthful and honest, and I respect what he's trying to do here. But I also will support the Chair's decision. Thank you. One more thing, if I have some more time, I haven't had much time this morning, but I think maybe this may be the last time I will be able to talk this morning because I refuse to stand here and tell you the pitfalls of not voting for LB 769 and the parental notification, how important that is to family unity. But starting this morning and a little bit last night, because it got awfully late, the list of names that you received yesterday, along with the purple balloons, I want you to know that I called ten people, ten people, and out of the ten people that I've talked to, nine people are very angry. Their name was not authorized to be used as signatures for choice. One of them was a professor at Creighton, one was an attorney in Omaha, and he begged me, he said, can I come down to the Legislature this morning and publicly say that I had nothing to do with authorizing my name to be used as Voices for Choice? And I want the people in the Rotunda to know that I'm not through calling some of these people. Some of them were out of town, I wasn't able to find them this morning, they were off to work. But I knew that some of those were close friends of mine and business people downtown. Halfway through the calls, I realized how their names got on the list, because I started asking the question, have you ever contributed to Planned Parenthood? And they said, yes. I said, are you on the list, mailing list for Planned Parenthood? They said, yes. And that's how their name got on. They took the mailing list, I'm assuming this, not saying this, that that might have been what happened, because every one that I called back said that they received mail from Planned Parenthood, but they did not authorize them to use their name as Voices for Choice. I wanted you to know that. Thank you.
