

with what you want and I won't go along with what you want unless you go along with what I want first. But we're going to see if a motion to bracket is made, those who say we ought to go ahead and get rid of this issue so we can move on to other things really mean that. And if they mean it, then if such a motion comes then that motion ought to be voted up. If it's voted down, I say you're insincere and you indeed enjoy this discussion and I like to bring as much enjoyment into the Legislature as I can. But on this particular motion which is not offered as a lark, it relates to the integrity of the rules, we should reconsider that vote wherein we failed to overrule the Chair. So I hope to get enough votes and it would take 25 on a reconsideration motion to position us to vote again so that we might vote in the way that is correct and appropriate.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. The question is the reconsideration. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? A record vote has been requested. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See page 490 of the Legislative Journal.) 10 ayes, 32 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to reconsider.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails. The call is raised. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a priority motion and that motion is to bracket LB 769 until March 20, 1990. It is offered by Senator Schimek.

PRESIDENT: Senator Schimek, please.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, Mr. President and members of the body, I haven't been on the floor for this entire discussion and I haven't spoken to this bill or to any of the amendments that have been offered, and I have sat here listening and trying to discern what really is going on under the surface and trying to look past some of the heated personal feelings, I think, that are engendered by this kind of a debate. And I have come to the conclusion as maybe some of the rest of you have, I want to find out, that we are not going to be able to end the debate on this bill soon. I think that I do agree with Senator McFarland to a degree. I believe that there are a lot of important issues out there for us to discuss. This is an important issue. I'm not trying to downplay the importance of this issue, but there are
