society, there is a very antifemale attitude. It is shown in magazines, in novels, in movies, on television depictions, the brutality that women are subjected to, the tortures, the demeaning roles in which they are placed. You can find a young woman without much money and pay her to take off all of her clothes, then she is condemned, but if there were not the heavy market for that, there would be no reason to pay her all that money. This is the way a society treats its women, and it carries over into what we are talking about here today. Never would anything as unfair as this be imposed on men, whether they are young men or old men. So I believe we need considerably more discussion which would not occur if we were talking about the bill, itself, because somebody would quickly say, Mr. Chairman, I respectfully call the question.

PRESIDENT: Your time is expired. Senator Crosby, please, followed by Senator Bernard-Stevens, and Senator Hefner.

SENATOR CROSBY: Excuse me, go ahead.

PRESIDENT: Yes, Senator Crosby, please.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Mr. President, and members. I am glad to see you smile a little bit this morning because we have been so emotional all week, but this is a very difficult subject to have a sense of humor about because we all feel so strongly one way or the other. I was pleased to hear Senator Chambers bring up those commercials because I hate them and tune them out, and there is a lot of...he does talk about some of the things that were back in the Dark Ages, I will use those...that particular phrase this morning, some of the thoughts about females and their souls and so on, but there are a lot of myths that went around when I, or maybe they weren't myths, but when I was a girl in the public school. Public school teachers, and a friend of mine told me the other day that she had heard this same thing, when they gave you a little lecture on how to get along with boys when you were out and so on, one of the big things, and the dean of women at the college told us this, too, always put a catalog or magazine on the boy's lap, if you have to sit on his lap in the car or something. They never told us why, they just said be sure and carry, well, you know that, years later I figured that out. So, see, now let's all smile at each other and say we are adult people. I saw Senator Chambers this morning earlier and he said, are you ready for the war, and said I don't think of it that way at all. I think it is a
