

PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR LABEDZ: They first give all the qualifications or the duties of a fund raising assistant. At the very end, it says, this is the qualifications: Above all, must be enthusiastic, must be positive, flexible, and pro-choice, and that is by the Planned Parenthood of Lincoln, and yet many of them have denied that they don't take any issue on what...either side, pro-choice, but they are supposed to be counseling service and family planning service, yet they evidently won't hire anybody unless they are pro-choice. I wonder what that does to their 501(c)(3).

CLERK: 15 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

So please return to your desks and record your presence. Please record your presence, like Senator Wesely, please. Senator Pirsch, Senator McFarland, Senator Nelson, Senator Scofield. And the question is, shall debate cease? And a roll call vote has been requested.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 497 of the Legislative Journal.) 30 ayes, 4 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.
