angry when Senator Chambers gets up and talks about the Franklin Credit Union and tells me that I cried. Yes, I admit that. will tell you, last night... I have a very ill daughter-in-law in the hospital, I have a sick husband, I didn't want to stay till nine o'clock last night. I haven't been home since Monday night because of the Franklin Credit Union meetings but I will be there every night because my daughter-in-law is on the board of Metro Right to Life and she is very ill with bone cancer but she thinks I'm more valuable here fighting for what she believes in, what I believe in and the unborn children come first and always will, even before my own family. And I will cry every time I hear another edition of what happened to our children. Senator Chambers, some day I would like you to stand up and tell me why you didn't have guts enough, regardless of what happened. I have frictions in the committee too. We all do, but, by golly, there's five of us that are going to stick there till the end and, hopefully, this will come to end because the people out there want a decision and they also want a decision on this. But you don't and Senator Landis don't and Bernard-Stevens don't want to go on with this bill because they know that a big majority of these legislators that are in this session, night to day, believe that this bill is important and it's more important than my own family. God help me, I will be here every day regardless. Senator Chambers, I do want one more You... I put this on my list too. It said did I...this was a public pulse letter. Did I read Steve Thomas's story correctly? I'm referring to the January 12th story. Chambers fights radical change. Appeals Court plan is advanced, in which State Senator Ernie Chambers was quoted as saying, the people will say, you mean they took away my right to appeal to the Supreme Court? And I will say, by God, you've got it right. Did Ernie say God? Don't tell me, he's seen the light, God. Don't worry, Ernie, as it happens to smarter people than you are.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Bernard-Stevens, followed by Senator Chambers and Senator Schmit.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Labedz, as she can do and does do so well, talks about the dedication that she has to this issue and I would never question that and her integrity has always been high, in my estimation, on the reasons for why she does what she does. But I also know that there are other people within the body that have serious family illnesses at this time that are not on the same side of
