continue to be protected by the Constitution. If you take it out of the Constitution, there is no constitutional protection of that right. Everything is left to the Legislature.

PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Those who love Initiative 300 don't want that left to the Legislature for fine tuning and handling. I didn't say those who were opposed to it. Those who were opposed to it frankly know that if it ever fell into the lap of the Legislature what would happen to it. Excuse me, those who support I 300 and want it to stay in place want its provisions to continue as the law, will not have that submitted to a vote of the Legislature. When it comes to working people it's a different matter. Their rights don't require the same type of guarantee. And why is there an Initiative 300? We hear that that exists and is necessary because farmers and small farms cannot compete against the corporate giants.

PRESIDENT: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I've had ten minutes?

PRESIDENT: Yes, you have. Thank you. Senator Langford, you're next followed by Senator Schmit and Senator Kristensen, but may I introduce some guests please first. Senator Schellpeper has guests under the north balcony, Dale Barth. Would you please stand, Dale. Thank you. Senator Kristensen has a guest under the north balcony, Marlene Faiman of the Little Blue NRD. Would you please stand, Marlene. And in the south balcony Senator Lowell Johnson has some guests. We have 42 juniors and sponsors from the North Bend Government class. Would you folks please stand and be recognized. Thank you for visiting us. Senator Schmit, please, followed by Senator Kristensen. Senator Kristensen, please, followed by Senator Wesely and Senator Schimek.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President. You know what Senator Chambers would like you to do is get all fired up about Initiative 300 and jump out of your chair like I'm sure Senator Baack would do when he hears just the mention of Initiative 300 and say, how dare they do anything like that again, or that he may try to invoke your feelings about LB 775 and the big businesses no matter how you felt about those things. Unfortunately, I didn't have the pleasure of hearing that
