SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I don't think there has been adequate discussion on this issue, and I would ask, and this is not just to delay or stall, I want you to rule, whether in your opinion, there has been adequate debate.

PRESIDENT: I'd rule that there has been.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Can you tell me for the record how many have discussed it, regardless of the side?

PRESIDENT: Three.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You mean I opened and two other people spoke? Or three others in addition to myself?

PRESIDENT: Three others and you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I won't challenge you, go ahead.

PRESIDENT: Okay. The question is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Senator Langford.

SENATOR LANCFORD: Mr. President, could we have a call of the house, please?

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall the house go under call? Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 14 ayes, 1 may to go under call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The house is under call. Will you please record your presence. Those not in the Chamber, please return so that we may continue and record your presence, please. Please look up to see if your light is on. Okay, call in votes have been authorized, and the question is, shall debate cease?

CLERK: Senator Lynch voting...you had voted yes, Senator. Senator Lamb voting yes, Senator Wehrbein voting yes, Senator Barrett voting yes, Senator Chizek voting yes, Senator Hartnett voting yes, Senator Hall voting yes, Senator Rod Johnson voting no.
