LB 163, 503A

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you, so ordered. The question again is the advancement of the bill to E & R engrossing. Those in favor of its advancement please vote aye, opposed nay. Shall the bill be advanced? Please record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 3 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance LB 503A.

SPEAKER BARRETT: LB 503A is advanced. LB 163.

CLERK: Mr. President, 163, I have E & R amendments, first of all, Senator.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to 163.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Any discussion? If not, shall the E & R amendments be adopted? All in favor say aye. Opposed no. Carried, they are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first amendment I have to the bill is by Senator Haberman. Senator, this is your amendment on page 433 of the Journal. It is a sunset provision, I think, Senator. Mr. President, Senator Rod Johnson would move to amend. Senator, this is your amendment on page 543.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Johnson.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: May I ask the Clerk if that is AM2268?

CLERK: AM2268, Senator.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Yeah, okay, thank you. Mr. Speaker, members, as you recall on General File, there were a number of amendments, six or seven to be exact, that were offered by a variety of senators, I think all with positive intent, on the bill, and rather than take a lot of the time on this floor to debate those, I asked each of the members if they would mind withdrawing those amendments so that we could meet privately off the floor and see if we could work in some of the ideas that these senators had to expedite the matter, rather than take each of the bills individually, or each of the amendments individually.
