SENATOR WESELY: No. No. No, it allows them to do what we thought they could do and there was some language problem they're clearing up that I understand.

SENATOR LANGFORD: Do you promise hand on Bible and all that good stuff?

SENATOR WESELY: I promise. I promise everything in here is okay.

SENATOR LANGFORD: Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Other discussion? Senator Wesely, would you care to close.

SENATOR WESELY: Yeah, Mr. Speaker, I can understand, the wording is a little difficult, Senator Langford, I can understand that question. And, frankly, all of these changes have been worked through. The Department of Health has like a podiatry, a chiropractic board, a massage therapy board, they all work and come with recommendations to the department. The department works with them and they come back with these clean-up bills and this amendment. And so all of these things have been approved by all those different folks all the way through the department, back to us, and so I don't think you will find difficulties. Hopefully, they have talked to everybody they need to and everybody is in agreement on these amendments. I don't think there is anything controversial in here. And I promise you if there is, we will take care of it. But, at this point, from what I can tell, we're okay. So I would move the amendment to further clarify some problems we have in some of the Health Department statutes, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. The question is the adoption of the Wesely amendment to 1064. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Voting on the Wesely amendment. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, please.
