voting rights.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you. We spent quite a lot of time this fall and I just wanted to be sure. Thank you, Carol.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Yes, thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Chambers, please.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I was at the hearing where this bill was held and I think it is a very good bill and the people speaking for it made an excellent case to justify its movement and the only reason I'm speaking, not that it really needs my support, but Senator Hefner and I shocked people by appearing on an amendment. I want to shock people by supporting a bill of Senator Pirsch, and I may have other surprises before the session is over.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Any other discussion? Anything else, Senator Pirsch?

SENATOR PIRSCH: No, just move for advancement.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Shall LB 978 be advanced to E & R? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 978.

SPEAKER BARRETT: LB 978 is advanced. LB 988.

CLERK: Mr. President...,

SPEAKER BARRETT: LB 888, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, 888 was a bill introduced by Senator Dierks. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 3 of this year, referred to Health Committee, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The Chair recognizes Senator Dierks.

SENATOR DIERKS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the body, LB 888 is a bill that will restrict the sale of rabies vaccines
