Have you all voted? Please record.
CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 831.

SPEAKER BARRETT: LB 831 advances. LB 932, Mr. Clerk.
CLERK: 932, Mr. President, introduced by Senators Scofield and Bernard-Stevens. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 3, referred to Revenue, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Bernard-Stevens, please.
SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. This is a bill introduced by Senator Scofield and myself which actually repeals what was done in 1988 in regards to the railroad lawsuit and that would be LB 1091 which many of us in the body fought very hard for in order to receive 7 . million to reimburse the subdivisions as much as possible for the funds lost in the railroad lawsuit era. Since that time the railroads have, in fact, worked with the State of Nebraska on a settlement and they are, in fact, now paying 25 percent of their personal property tax to the subdivisions. This bill, 932, would simply take out the part of 1091 which would then imply that all the 25 percent would be able to go back to the subdivisions, and I ask that the bill be advanced to $E \& R$ Initial.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Discussion? Questions? Seeing none, those in favor of the advancement of the bill vote aye, opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 932.

SPEAKER BARRETT: LB 932 advances. LB 1178.
CLERK: 1178, Mr. President, offered by the Business and Labor Committee and signed by its members. (Read title.) It was introduced on January 17 of this year, referred to Business and Labor, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill, Mr. President.
