CLERK: 11 ayes, 1 may to go under call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The house is under call. Please return to your seats and record your presence. Call-in votes are authorized.

CLERK: Senator Moore voting yes.

PRESIDENT: Please return to your seats, ladies and gentlemen. Those not in the Chamber, please return to the Chamber so we may continue.

CLERK: Senator...you had voted yes, Senator. Senator Hall voting yes. Senator Morrissey voting yes.

PRESIDENT: Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: The committee amendments are adopted. Anything further on the bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Okay, on the advancement of the bill, Senator Withem.

SENATOR WITHEM: Yes, I really haven't explained much about the bill, other than to indicate to you when we introduced the committee amendments. to indicate that most of it deals with report deadlines, repealing of obsolete language, those types of things. Money from temporary school fund dollars will now go directly to the school district as opposed to the county officials who then appropriate them on out, if this passes, various dates or submission of data will be changed.
