SENATOR WESELY: The only inquiry I am concerned about is to not foreclose...the other option would be to make a motion to reject and I don't know that we need to do that. That's why I'm uncertain about whether I need to come forward. What I would like to do is to allow us to resolve this but reserve the right to take further action. I don't want to foreclose that option, is all I'm concerned about, and I don't think we do that by moving forward with other appointments. If I'm not mistaken on that, then that's fine.

PRESIDENT: Fine. You weren't asking me a question, were you?

SENATOR WESELY: Well, I just want to...no, that's all right. I assume that there are further options that we have available and we can go on from here.

PRESIDENT: Yes. Senator Wesely, you have another appointment for recommendation.

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, we have...shall we take...we'll take two further reports dealing with the Board of Health, Bruce Gilmore, Margaret Allington, Carl Maltas, Kathryn Simon, Dr. Timothy Wahl, and another appointment, Betty Matz to the Foster Care Review Board. These were approved, six in favor, none opposed, one absent. And do we take the other one as well?

PRESIDENT: Can we take them all at one time, Senator?

SENATOR WESELY: Sure. Patricia A. McQuillan, Board of Health, and Marilyn Wartig, Rural Health Manpower Commission. Again, six in favor, none opposed, one absent. I would move for the adoption...or confirmation of these appointments.

PRESIDENT: Okay, the call is raised. Senator Warner, did you wish to speak on this? Senator Landis, did you wish to speak on it. No, okay. Any further discussion, Senator Wesely? And how many were there that we're voting on in its entirety?

SENATOR WESELY: We are voting on a total of two, four, six, eight...eight appointments to the Board of Health, Foster Care Review Board and Rural Health Manpower Commission.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion. All those in favor of appointing all of these members please vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.
