house and a roll call vote.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. The question is, shall the house go under call? Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record.

CLERK: 14 ayes, 1 may to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The house is under call. Members. return to your seats and record your presence. Those outside the Legislative Chamber, please return and record your presence. Unauthorized personnel, please leave the floor. The Chair is pleased to pause and note that Senator Kristensen has a guest under the north balcony, Doris Thompson from Minden. Would you please stand and be recognized. The Chair is pleased also to introduce two guests under the south balcony, Jennie Gutierrez from Lexington and Arlene McFall from Holdrege. ladies please stand and be recognized. Thank you. Would you We're glad to have you with us. Senators Lamb, Landis, Langford. Elmer, please check in. Senator Haberman, the house is under Senator Schmit, the house is under call. Senators Haberman and McFarland, the house is under call. Chambers, Senator Haberman is on his way, may we proceed. Members, return to your seats for a roll call vote. The question before the body is the adoption of the Chambers amendment to the Hefner amendment to 315. Mr. Clerk, call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote read. See page 1044 of the Legislative Journal.) 16 ayes, 23 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The motion fails. The call is raised. Mr. Clerk.
