labor unions want their employees to have the right to go to work half drunk. And as one of the...I have been very mad in the past but that made me real mad. They just simply didn't understand. You don't allow any tolerance. It is subject to abuse, and that abuse then goes to a supervisor who decides I am going to test this person because my wife likes him or my wife doesn't like him or I don't like their tie, or whatever, and when you have got a zero, point, zero tolerance in there, people can be subject to...

SPEAKER BARRETT: Time.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: ...penalties for having taken cough medicine. Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Senator Chambers, followed by Senator Hall.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, and members of the Legislature, I am going to tell you what the real problem is that we are having here. This amendment should not even be something that we are trying to work our way through to attach to this bill. The other amendments, I am with Senator Morrissey on, should not have been added to the bill, but once Senator Hefner opened the floodgates, Senator Hall was left with no choice other than to try to get some standards relative to testing into the bill since it had been modified so drastically. The railroads, known to attach a lot of cars to an engine, say what difference is it going to make if you attach a few more. But the thing to keep in mind, although the railroads are bringing this, would Senator Wehrbein, are you here?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, can I ask you a question?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Wehrbein, are you in a position to say that every railroad has the same standards as the railroad...what railroad asked you to bring this particular amendment?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: The Union Pacific.
