

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Mr. President, members. Just very briefly, I would urge adoption of this amendment. It makes sense not to fragment to me. And, as I said originally, I brought this, I felt this amendment deserved to be heard. It makes sense not to fragment the testing procedures, or whatever policies that are operated under state by state, and to allow this to go to the federal exemptions is, to me, ... come under federal mandated or regulated drug testing programs makes sense in the case of interstate commerce. So I'd urge your adoption of this amendment.
