not to cease debate, and so I will yield the rest of my time to him. I would like to hear what he has to say about degradable disposable diapers.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers, please.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature, I would like to say a very few words on this subject. Thank you very much.

PRESIDENT: And that is the closing on the amendment. All those in favor of the amendment vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please. Senator Hefner. Pardon me.

SENATOR HEFNER: I would like to have a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT: Okay, a roll call vote has been requested. We will go forward. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1066 of the Legislative Journal.) 9 ayes, 20 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment fails. That is the last amendment, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: No, sir.

PRESIDENT: No?

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is by Senator Hefner. Senator, this is your AM2147.

SENATOR HEFNER: Withdraw that.

PRESIDENT: You wish to withdraw that. It is withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is by Senator Schimek. This is AM2124.

PRESIDENT: Senator Moore, will you take that please?

SENATOR MOORE: Yes, Mr. President, it is not quite as unusual, unholy alliance between Senators Hefner and Chambers, but Senator Schimek and Moore are working together on this
