

amendment. The situation is that there is a few things that we can agree on, there still is a few things we can't agree on. One situation is that I think though Senator Morrissey would prefer a million and a half dollars, he sees the wisdom in a half a million dollars in the bill. We can agree on that. The one thing that Senator Schimek and myself and Senator Rod Johnson, the one thing that we cannot agree on is whether or not you just let DEC write the plan or create a committee, the legislative oversight with committee created. For a variety of reasons, that is what Senator Schimek's amendment is trying to do. We have some problems with the amendment. For the sake of allowing the body, and making it simple and understandable, we are going to withdraw this amendment at this time, offer it at a later time to Senator Rod Johnson's amendment so the body can simply make the decision on whether or not they would like to write in this bill and this plan legislative oversight. So the Schimek amendment will come back as an amendment to Rod Johnson's pending amendment. So with that, on behalf of Senator Schimek, I will withdraw the amendment.

PRESIDENT: It is withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment then, Senator, I have a note, this is AM2450, I have a note, this is, again, offered by Senator Schimek, but I have a note that she wanted to withdraw this as well, is that consistent? Okay.

PRESIDENT: Senator Moore, by that gesture, did you mean you wish to withdraw it. Okay, it is withdrawn.
