

And the answer is, no, Senator Moore still wants to go with a half a million dollar General Fund support for this program. And I would like to also comment that in my original amendment it calls for the Department of Environmental Control to prepare a study or a plan but it also says any money that's generated, that's left over, was also to be used in the implementation of the plan. So the 500,000 does not go solely toward just doing a study. It also would allow whatever left-over funds, if the plan is developed, is less than 500,000, then that money can be used in the implementation of the plan. So just a point of clarification there. But I would strongly urge you that it doesn't appear to me there is any need for this...for this committee. I just...I guess I just don't see any need for it. I think that's what the Control Council is there for and let's them do the work.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Thank you. Senator Morrissey, please.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Yes, Mr. President and members, again, I think we're focusing and we're getting towards the end here. You've got a choice here of what what kind of horse you want to ride across the line. Make your vote, get on that horse and ride it all the way home. Take her right into the barn, because that's what we need to do. I'm not going to argue strongly either way here. The Environmental Control Council will have to hold hearings and they will provide for citizen input. The Environmental Control Council is made up very similar to this amendment of Senator Schimek's, but the amendment of Senator Schimek also allows legislative input. That's your decision to make. It will...the committee will come down, as written, January 1, 1992. So make your decision here. It's simple, who do you want to do the plan? Strongly agree with the plan. Like I said, get on the horse and ride it all the way into the barn, whichever one you decide on now. Thank you.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Thank you. Senator Moore, there are no other lights on, would you care to close on your amendment to the amendment?

SENATOR MOORE: I hesitate to do this. Since there is only one person sitting in a chair on the right side of the body, I would ask for a call of the house. Now two...I miscounted. I would request a call of the house prior to my closing so that I can...not that I love my voice, only so that I can at least tell them what they're voting on.
