that has shown...has even been talked about, or who has been evidenced to have the kinds of background and the experience that Dr. Thorson has. Given that, I believe that we have a responsibility to choose the person who appears to be the most qualified, who has been the person who's been selected at this point in time. The questions can go on endlessly. Hypothetical questions keep being asked. No one can give you the answer to those kinds of questions, not the opposing side, nor the persons that they're asking the questions to. A hypothetical question doesn't have an answer. So you can keep on finding more questions, more questions, and more things that you're saying, what if this happened. No one knows. We have to finally say we must go forward, we have to do it with the best resources that we have, with the best people that we possibly can come up with, the ones who are the most qualified. I don't know of anyone else who's more qualified than Dr. Thorson. And I have to remind you that one of the things that has been expressed over and over by the folks that have been opposed to this is the fact that they don't trust outsiders, they don't trust US Ecology. They want it to be people that are within the Dr. Thorson, as was mentioned by Senator Crosby, is a fellow Nebraskan. Look at his resume, his background, his experience. We have to look at that. We have to try to be as objective as we can. I know it's easier for those of us who have not had actually to be the center of a site selection process area. that's our job then, as other senators in the body, to try to look at this objectively. We did ask questions of Dr. Thorson following the confirmation hearing. I had a number of questions that I wanted to have answers to, and Senator Schmit put those in the form of questions and added other questions of his own, sent those to Dr. Thorson, and the members of the committee, at least at this point in time I know, all have that before them. I think that, you know, as far as Senator Morrissey is concerned the question on shared liability is a question of concern that he's had for a long time. We did ask that question again, probably not as fast or as the resolution of that concern, but at least or maybe in the way you'd like to have it answered, Senator Morrissey, but I do have to say that at the end of his response he does talk about...he does believe, he agrees that there is not, there needs to be clearer intent concerning shared liability, and that there is some concern about the word itself, liability, and that there is some ambiguity. And so he has drafted a memo to the fellow commissioners asking that this be looked at and addressed in the compact state legislative bodies,...
