SENATOR HEFNER: ...and call in votes.

PRESIDENT: Okay. The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 21 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: We are under call. Please record your presence. Those not in the Chamber, please return to the Chamber and record your presence. Looking for Senator Lindsay, Senator Beck, Senator Nelson, Senator Scofield, Senator Jacky Smith, Senator Chambers. We're looking for Senator Chambers. Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President, I'd like to have a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT: Okay. Roll call vote has been requested. You wish to go ahead without Senator Chambers? Okay. We'll go ahead without Senator Chambers. The question is the suspension of the rules, and a roll call vote. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 1143-44 of the Legislative Journal.) 26 ayes, 17 nays, Mr. President, on the suspension motion.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails. Do you have something for the record, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Enrollment and Review reports LB 315 to Select File with E & R amendments attached. And I have amendments to be printed to LB 1059 by Senator Hall. That's all that I have, Mr. President. (See page 1144 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: We're back on the confirmation report. The call is raised. Senator McFarland, you're first.
