CLERK: 21 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of LR 272.

PRESIDENT: The resolution is adopted. LR 273, please.

CLERK: LR 273, Mr. President, offered by Senator Rod Johnson. (Read brief description of resolution.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Rod Johnson, please.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Mr. President, members, this resolution honors the Hampton girls for winning the Class D-2 state championship. I must apologize to Senator Peterson. I didn't vote red on his resolution for no reason. Unfortunately, his Battle Creek girls beat my home town of Sutton, but the boys are back in town today and they are going to start their way to a second state championship so we hope they'll be able to do that, but on this resolution, I want to honor the Hampton girls who beat the Lawrence girls for the D-2 state championship.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? If not, the question is the adoption of the resolution. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of LR 273.

PRESIDENT: The resolution is adopted. If you will please return to your seats, ladies and gentlemen, we'll begin Final Reading. (Gavel.) If you'll please return to your seats we'll begin Final Reading. I might explain to the students in the balconies that on Final Reading the Constitution requires that all bills, before they are voted on, and the Final Reading must be read in their entirety. The Clerk goes pretty fast, so you may not be able to catch all of the words, but you'll have to listen closely. Please return to your seats, gentlemen. I think all the ladies are in their seats. (Gavel.) Please return to your seats. Mr. Clerk, LB 1044.

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 1044 pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk, please.
