the College of Dentistry whereby, beginning in 1991, five entering freshmen at Chadron State will be reserved slots in the Medical School satisfactory completion upon of undergraduate years at Chadron. There will also be two of those slots to the College of Dentistry. We've allocated \$3,500 toward that to support implementation and start-up costs. Item number 3 is a Cash Fund estimate adjustment to all college campuses, Chadron, Kearney, Peru and Wayne. With increased enrollments additional cash funds are coming in and this authorizes them to expend this amount of cash funds. I won't go into the figures exactly, but we do have those, too. number 4 is Peru State, Administrative Computer Hardware and Software Maintenance Contract. This is an amount of \$76,357 for both years to meet expenses associated with administrative computer hardware and software contracts. It's a maintenance contract that was inadvertently left out last year. These are put back in. Item number 5 has to do with automating of the state college libraries. The Governor's recommendation was \$3,475,616 over a three-year period to acquire and install automated library systems at each of the four state colleges. The committee amendment reduces total funding over three-year period by \$20,000, reflecting an adjustment in the software cost. The committee also alters the Governor's recommended phase-in appropriation, deferring first and second year funding for the networking of the campuses to the second and third years respectively. The amount remains the same, but it was spread out over a three-year period, and the first year was delayed into the second and third. I have quite a bit of detail on what is involved in the library automation if anyone is interested in more detail, but it has to do with automating the card catalogs, the material acquisitions, the material circulation records, the management and analytical reports and so forth as well as a lot of linking of the campuses, linking of the buildings on campuses. Item number 6 is an amount of \$20,000 to equip a classroom at Chadron, having to do with the NEB*SAT program to facilitate satellite delivery of a two-tiered MBA program in conjunction with UN-L. This relates back to the earlier issue of a \$25,000 for staff in that program. Item number 7 is an amount of \$1,662,000 in '90-91, \$618,000 '91-92, having to do with renovating the primary electrical distribution system at Kearney State. We found as the buildings have progressed out there, there is not enough capacity in the primary electrical distribution system and this is a process of updating the electrical system, the distribution system out there to be able to handle future loads. We are at capacity
