

Department of Revenue. The next agency, Agency 48, the Postsecondary Coordinating Commission, which is in section, there was no committee amendments, Section 29, page 18 of the summary. Basically what it is here is the Executive Director of that agency retired last summer. The state was needed to pay \$90,878 for vacation and sick leave that was due to that person. Next agency, 52, which is, once again, as it was unamended by the committee in Section 50 of the bill, page 27 of the bill summary, is \$115,000 appropriation to complete the sewer system at the State Agricultural Park and this will do a variety of things as far as straw catcher. It's been an ongoing process, been working with the City of Lincoln trying to reduce the amount of runoff into Antelope Creek and do some other things there. There is actually \$150,000 in new appropriation, \$36,000 I believe is the number in an ongoing appropriation was there in the past, hopefully finish up that work up there at Ag Park. Agency 65, Department of Administrative Services, the only actual General Fund Appropriation is \$15,000 recommended by the Governor, approved by the Committee, which will basically implement the policy of the drug-free work place policy. That's the actual appropriation to implement that program with those that contract with the State of Nebraska. There is a variety of other large numbers which are all Revolving Funds, you know, mailing and copying, giving those expenses going up in the Department of Administrative Services. Of the Transportation Service Bureau there is a \$323,000 Revolving Fund increase in appropriation and that is basically due to the fact that in the 1989 session this Legislature passed a number of bills and A bills but there was not the proper mechanisms in there and it was not taken into account the amount of cars that needed to be purchased by the state to implement those policies passed last year. For that reason, that's what...that's an increase in the Transportation Services Bureau to pay for those cars that were not in A bills of \$323,000. And then lastly, there was a large increase in the Building Division, a Revolving Fund with a variety of moves that we've had with the new CDP center and other things going on in the State Capitol that has some additional authority to do the proper things necessary, necessary things there. The last two agencies are both small committee amendments. The first in the Department of Economic Development, which is in Section 14 of the bill, which basically increases to the tune of \$16,460, the addition of four field staff offices and one field staff supervisor with a floor amendment on the last year's budget bill. It's an amendment that was made on the floor last year, if you remember, and the
