

regional service offices. This would be an increase to make that show up properly in their budget. And that is strictly a...is not a...once again, is not an increase in appropriation, that is strictly the accurate personal service limitation that have to go in that bill to correct that floor amendment last year. Last agency I have is Accountability and Disclosure, Agency 87. This is a \$7,000 appropriation to pay for unused sick leave benefits. This is a person, individual in that office deceased, passed away in the last year, and this is the unused sick and vacation leave to that person's family, once again, totaling \$7,000. Those are the agencies that I have and I am complete.

PRESIDENT NICHOL PRESIDING

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Hannibal.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Thank you, Mr. President and members, I am the last person to speak. You'll be happy to hear that. I have four agencies to cover. I might depart just a little bit from the listing that you might have there and try to make it as brief as possible. We've gone on a long time about what we're trying to do and I'm sure we'll have more chance to discuss this as we start having general discussion and amendments. The first agency I would like to talk to you about is the Department of Motor Vehicles. Actually we did nothing to the bill differently. The bill just allowed for some increase in personal service limitations, no increase in any funds and the committee chose not to amend that in any way. The second agency I want to talk about just briefly is the Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice, skipping to my last of the four, and the small items that we did include in there that were not in the original was a new additional training officer for the Law Enforcement Training Facility in Grand Island, a small \$35,000 increase, and we made some shifts in some Cash Funds and we allow for some Cash Funds for county attorneys continuing education program. The major difference between what the committee amendments do and the bill does, it doesn't involve funding to speak of, but involves keeping the funding for the antidrug abuse fund that is a relatively large amount of funds including federal funding match. We elected to keep those funds in the Crime Commission's budget whereas the Governor's bill took those same kinds of funds and allocated them out to the agencies that the Crime Commission has contracted in the past. We have added a few extra funds in there, about \$50,000 I
