

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Weihing, please.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Did I have some time?

One of the things I think is unfortunate, though, because of the manner in which the various amendments were offered and the manner in which the Legislature disposed of them, we really have not done the job of shaping, getting the body's input into the way this bill should look. We have not adopted any amendments to the bill and there may need to be some. I am not lobbying for any at this particular point. The ones that were proposed I didn't think were good proposals.
