

so much money and there will be vetoes. We're going to pass things this year that are going to be vetoed. We don't know what those measures will be. I don't know that as we pass 1031, or the amendments to that, that we have, anyone of us, any sure knowledge of what those vetoes might be. But I would share with you that if we would reconsider our vote on Monday and then adopt this \$900,000 appropriation to complete the renovation of the 22 greenhouses, that it will help us to be better prepared to serve Nebraska and national agriculture in the future, that at least we will be placing that issue in consideration with all of the other issues that may or may not be vetoed. So I don't think that that is a real item of concern for us this morning...this afternoon. I do think an item of concern for us this afternoon is a trite phrase that we use a lot on the floor and that's send a message, send a message. By reconsidering and then adopting this amendment, we're sending a message to the basic fundamental part of our economy that we do have a consideration and appreciation for agriculture and we are interested in the future of Nebraska. Currently, we're looking at declining revenues in the state. The easiest way to forecast what's happening in the future is to check the Chicago Board of Trade and the mercantile simply because of the overwhelming volume of dollars that are generated by agriculture in our system, the money that's brought in to serve all of us to be redistributed. If we allow our cow to go dry, from where will we get the milk? I would encourage your reconsideration. Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. The question before the body is the motion to reconsider the vote taken on the Coordsen amendment which failed. All in favor of the reconsideration motion, please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record. Senator Coordsen.

SENATOR COORDSEN: I want a call of the house and a roll call vote.
