got the votes, I guess it will work. But it's an interesting process, again I would mention. And I would just ask one more question. Has anybody from the Ag Builders suggested to the university that, you know, Senator Coordsen, to ask them to spend a million dollars out of the 75 or 80 million they've got on a daily basis to pay for this?

COORDSEN: SENATOR I'm not going to dispute your 70 or 80 million dollars because those are your figures. should clarify just a little bit the (interruption).

SENATOR LYNCH: Oh, that's all right, Senator Coordsen, just a day to day...has anybody ever talked to you from the Ag Builders about a process like that, yes or no?

SENATOR COORDSEN: No, because...

SENATOR LYNCH: Okay, thank you. That's...all I wanted to say is but, by the way, they're not my figures, the Treasurer of the state puts those numbers out every month for your review.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: All I'm going to say has nothing to do with the issue at the moment but since Senator Moore brought it up, I think the issue Senator Moore is talking about is not the resolution, it was the issue in another amendment, as I recall, as to whether we should have lump sum or by campus. legislation that is proposed is by campus and there was concern that that would create end runs, as I recall, and I just was going to...and I have argued that it doesn't really make any difference what you have in the bill, end runs occur now, runs will occur in the future, as long as there is 25 people in here who want to support it, it will happen and it means nothing one way or the other. And whether those end runs should be in capital construction or operations, that flows back and forth with whatever interest group is working a particular year and sometimes it's operations and sometimes it's construction and that's just said from my viewpoint alone. again, I would say, as far as this issue is concerned, that whether you spend 900,000 here or 900,000 somewhere else, that's...certainly, I accept the judgment of 25 people and I know that you all understand that you can't spend the same 900,000 twice and that's the only decision you have to make.
