cannot discriminate against students who are needy because they want to participate in athletics. If anything, we ought to be trying to find a way to give them something else. But what Senator Warner's position seems to reflect, and I'm saying it reflects, not that it's his, it seems to reflect that attitude of the university that those who come to the University of Nebraska with little should have even that little taken from them. If they can't demonstrate the need, they don't...

SPEAKER BARRETT: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...qualify for these programs. If they demonstrate the need, then there should be no artificial barriers erected by the athletic department because we're talking about nonathletic academic aid and there should be no provisos, no conditions, no temporizing that would require certain students, only certain students who meet every requirement laid down in statute or told that they cannot participate in this aid. So I hope you will adopt this intent language.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. The question is the adoption of the Chambers amendment to the committee amendments to LB 1031. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I'll ask for a call of the house and call in votes.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The question is, shall the house go under call? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record.

CLERK: 14 ayes, 1 may to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The house is under call. Members, report to your seats and record your presence. Those members outside the Chamber, please return. Call in votes have been authorized. Senator Moore, would you like to check in, please. Senator Schmit, Senator Johnson. Senator Beck, would you please record your presence. Senator Haberman. Senator Nelson, please check in. Call in votes have been authorized.
