SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, and members of the body, just spoke with Senator Warner and Senator Warner informed me that the Revenue Department could, at the present time, with the funds they have contract with out-of-state auditors. They have this authority to do that. They could do that without the additional money. That is where I am coming from and I would like to have this body come from. They have plenty of money. The resolution of intent will say, take your \$80,000 of all the millions of dollars that we have given you...

SENATOR HANNIBAL:

SENATOR HABERMAN: ...and contract with out-of-state auditors. We are not going to give you any more money. Do your job.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Time is up.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Thank you.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Thank you. The question before you is the adoption of the Morrissey amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed may. Senator Morrissey, please.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Mr. President, to speed things up, I would ask for a call of the house.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: The question is, shall the house come under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 14 ayes, 1 may to go under call, Mr. President.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: The house is under call. Please record your presence. All senators not on the floor, please return to the Chamber and record your presence. The house is under call. All unauthorized people, please leave the floor. Please look up to see if you have recorded your presence. Senator Smith, would you record your presence please. Senator Warner, please. Senator Landis, please. The house is under call, please report to the Chamber and record your presence. Senator Chambers, please, Senator Lynch, please report to the Chamber. Senator Rogers, record your presence, please. Did you care for a roll call vote or do you want...you want to take call in votes. Senator Morrissey has suggested he would accept call in votes.
