and we need to decide in what direction we want to go in the future as far as funding these programs. I know that Senator Goodrich had an amendment in there talking about funding some residencies with Creighton. I have no problem with looking at that. I think we need to look at all of those aspects because any of the programs that are going to direct physicians to rural areas, I think we need to be looking at very, very carefully. Health care and rural health care is going to become one of the major issues in this state as the years continue because we'd see our population increasing in age. We are going to have to have these physicians in the rural areas. I think all of these programs are very worthwhile. With that, I would urge the body to adopt this amendment to 1031. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. The question is the adoption of the Baack amendment to LB 1031. Those in favor of that motion please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Baack, et al's amendment.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The amendment is adopted.

Mr. President, I now have a priority motion. Crosby would move to reconsider the vote on the Kristensen amendment to the committee amendments taken yesterday. amendment had to deal with the Museum on Nebraska Arts.

But some things were said yesterday, I just want to point out a couple of things about Sheldon here in Lincoln, Sheldon Gallery. Sheldon Gallery is a twentieth century art gallery and includes art from everywhere
