necessary activities of the soil in the crop production, much of that was done right by the farmers and farmers within this state. I feel it is very desirable that we have the examples of that early equipment so that we can see the progression that has taken place, so that we can see that our total society out there contributed to this. It was no single stroke of genius by any one person. The genius came from the many, many individuals throughout this state...

SPEAKER BARRETT: One minute.

SENATOR WEIHING: ...in the development of these tillage...pieces of tillage equipment, particularly in the earlier days. And we put in a lot of money for museums and when we speak of museums we normally think of art museums, but we need the museums also for the historical heritage that we have and our heritage in Nebraska is agriculture. The asking of \$5,000 is just pittance but that has real meaning for what is attempting to be done. And there are a number of people who have been putting in a great deal of time towards bringing about this preservation. They recognize that in the future, in the future, as well as now, we will wish to know how did this all develop.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Time.

SENATOR WEIHING: And it's so interesting and so fascinating because it is the ingenuity of the people within our society...

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you.

SENATOR WEIHING: ...that gives us an insight to our own abilities when we are confronted with adversities and that adversities can be overcome through our own endeavors. And it's nice to know that and to be able to see it. Conclusion of my remarks.
