SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I will comment as any of these issues, of course, are justified. I thought I should mention that, based on the Regents' priority list, which Senator Moore had made reference to the status of this particular one, but we have generally followed fairly closely although it's not perceived to be that way sometimes and occasionally it's not. But the items of their second, third and fourth priority, and fifth priority, are all scheduled to be funded or consideration for funding. Their first priority was some renovation of classrooms which is a smaller amount but was not included currently. And then the other projects, if it's any interest as to their priority, there is the Nebraska Center for Advanced Technology at UN-L which is 27.7...\$23.7 million, although that is a project some of you probably are familiar with as being, hopefully, funded out of federal funds, or a large part, if that ever happens. Then the other projects that were on the Regents' list included the Swanson Center addition at the Med Center. There are some universitywide code requirements which we always fund that is ranked as eight but we always fund some dollar amount to meet the highest emergency fire code safety requirements. Then the next project was Allwine Hall engineering renovation at UN-O, the Shackelford Addition at the Med Center and there is universitywide computer equipment, then Arts and Science remodeling at UN-O and then the Mead plant which, obviously, would be a nice thing to do but I thought you might want to know what the priority of the Regents were.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Any other discussion on the amendment? Senator Schmit, would you like to close?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Just briefly, Mr. President. As I said, I recognize the limitation on funds. I recognize that we all have priorities. I know that you will vote as your conscience dictates and that's all I'm going to ask. I hope that there are enough there who feel as I do that it is a priority item that ought to be addressed at this time and give us an affirmative vote. Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. The question is the adoption of the Schmit amendment to LB 1031. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Voting on the Schmit amendment. Have you all voted? Record, please.
