debate vote aye, those opposed no. Record, Mr. Clerk. Oh, that is right, keep voting. Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SENATOR LAMB: Debate is ceased. Senator Haberman to close.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, and members of the body, we have people out there crying for help, and with those words, I would ask that you adopt the amendment. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR LAMB: The motion is the adoption of the amendment by Senator Haberman. Those in support vote aye, those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 mays on the adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR LAMB: The amendment is adopted. Next amendment, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is from Senator Schmit. That amendment is found on page 1366.

SENATOR LAMB: The Chair recognizes Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, and members, this amendment is an amendment which provides \$24,000 to be included to support an academic counseling position and related costs to serve the academic and other counseling needs of students, who at the present time are attending the Nebraska Indian Community College, and this money would be provided to provide a position at Wayne for persons who will transfer to baccalaureate programs of study at Wayne State College and other postsecondary institutions. As you know, there is an institution that is called the Nebraska Indian Community College and provided...it is federally funded, provides for the needs of the persons from the Indian community, but there are a large number of students who are not Indian who attend that facility and then frequently transfer to Wayne and to other institutions. would provide for a position to serve actually all of the students but principally those students who are non-Native Americans, who would then be transferring to other institutions.
