I think we're clear at least on what we're doing here right now, but for anybody who is confused, once again, the original potato specialist proposal is in the mainline bill and this bill then is...its future, frankly, was to be killed and the committee decided they needed a bill. We wanted to address this issue. We recognized the growth at Kearney and the need for classroom space and, therefore, we propose adding this amendment which allows the money to start the planning to address the classroom space needs at Kearney. It's necessary, it's needed. If you have a growing institution, I think you have no choice but to address it and so I would ask you to approve the amendment. Thank you.
