as we get some language that would, in essence say, ultimately gets into a program and enters the program. Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President and members of the body, I think Senator Goodrich is exactly correct because I was having a problem with that too. It says, if the individual discharged is for misconduct, as defined in subsection (1) or (2) of this subdivision, he or she shall only be subject to one week disqualification period if he or she enrolls. And, as I understand it, Senator Ashford, you strike "enroll" and put "applies".

SENATOR ASHFORD: No, no, no I don't. Senator Hefner, I'm not taking "enroll" out. And I totally agree with Senator Goodrich that if we need to change the language, let's change it. What I'm saying is applies to enroll. So "enroll" is still there.

SENATOR HEFNER: Okay, okay.

SENATOR ASHFORD: Yeah.

SENATOR HEFNER: I understood that you struck "enroll".

SENATOR ASHFORD: No, no.

SENATOR HEFNER: You're saying "apply and enroll".

SENATOR ASHFORD: Correct. Right.

SENATOR HEFNER: Okay, but if we need...

SENATOR ASHFORD: Applies to enroll.

SENATOR HEFNER: Apply to enroll, but if...after we...if we adopt this amendment and you don't...and we don't think that the language is quite right, you're willing to clarify it.

SENATOR ASHFORD: Absolutely, because my intent is exactly as Senator Goodrich...

SENATOR HEFNER: Okay, thank you.
