

you don't need to have the Commissioner of Labor do a bed check on these individuals to make sure that they're in the program. That's not necessary. That is not necessary and it, I think, puts a very onerous reporting requirement on the Commissioner of Labor and it doesn't belong there. It is not necessary if someone is going to satisfactorily complete the program. We don't change that language. That's still there. And all we do with the first half of the amendment is strike the Commissioner of Labor from determining what programs are to be approved, use basically the list that the Department of Health has in place. I think that that just...

PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR HALL: ...makes very good economic sense in terms of time. You don't need to burden the Commissioner of Labor with these types of things when you already have the provisions out there already sanctioned, already being used by other areas of state government. It only makes sense to transfer them to the Department of Labor. I would urge the adoption of the amendment.
