call. Senator Hall, may we proceed. Senator Haberman is on his way. McFarland is...Senator McFarland. We haven't had a report yet. Thank you. A roll call vote has been requested on the adoption of the Hall amendment to the Coordsen amendment. Members, please return to your seats for a roll call vote. (Gavel.) Mr. Clerk, proceed.

CLERK: (Roll call vote read. See page 1442 of the Legislative Journal.) 18 ayes, 17 nays, Mr. President, on the amendment.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The motion fails. The call is raised. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, I believe we're back to Senator Coordsen's amendment.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Discussion now on the adoption of the Coordsen amendment. Senator Abboud. Thank you. Any other discussion? Seeing none, Senator Coordsen, would you like to close?

SENATOR COORDSEN: Just move the adoption of the amendment, $\mbox{\rm Mr.}$ Speaker.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. The question is the adoption of the Coordsen amendment to LB 315. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, please.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Coordsen's amendment to the bill.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Wehrbein would move to amend the bill. (The Wehrbein amendment appears on page 1443 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BARRETT: The Chair recognizes Senator Wehrbein.
