And then there is an appropriation of 44,000 to the Department of Labor which may or may not be expended but there...currently, there are elevator inspections in Omaha that are paid for by the City of Omaha, they would have the option, and this is not completed, but they could have the option to decline to continue to fund that position which then would become a state responsibility. And the anticipated costs, if the state eventually takes that over, then would be an amount of 44,000. That could occur prior to the time that the Legislature convenes again and if it did, of course, then it ought to...the authorization for the funding needs to be there. In the event it does not occur, why the money just simply would not be utilized. There is some additional authorization in the Department of Social Services for the utilization review of medical services that is a part of the ongoing program that's been there for some time. Federal regulations require precertification of inpatient psychiatric admissions for persons under 21. The department currently is doing some of these but the federal regulations require that the reviews be conducted by an independent team and this will provide the funding, in effect, to do that program. There is a \$5,000 increase to the Department of Water Resources Cash Fund expenditure, no General Fund, but this is merely to provide...allow them to charge for copies of documents that they are having increased requests for and those making the requests have to pay for them but these are primarily in relation to the Nebraska-Wyoming lawsuit. It has nothing to do with the lawsuit other than those people who want copies of the records that are involved. There is an increase in the authorization of the Cash Fund estimate for Wayne State College, together with the personal service limitation. This is a revision that came from Wayne State in their Cash Fund estimates since the time that we put the bill together, originally primarily relating to increased receipts because of increased enrollments. Then the final amendment would affect the University of Nebraska in which apparently there will be...as a part of the university's initiated separate claims against John Mansfield for asbestos problems. It appears that they may receive approximately \$100,000 as at least a partial settlement of a claim that originally, I believe, was 950,000. What we are putting in is simply language because traditionally, as money is returned from this kind of a situation, it would be returned to the fund that provided the funds originally. Since, obviously, this is a mixture of funds over a period of time, it would be difficult to track and so what the language does, it allows the university to keep those funds in a separate account
