CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is by Senator Warner as Chair of the committee. I have AM3137 in front of me, Senator.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The Chair recognizes Chairman Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this amendment is just language. In the original committee amendment we had some language relative to a report from the Department of Agriculture on fuel quality testing. It was pretty limited only to the possibility of utilization of a couple of funds in that agency to do this. And it was simply not adequate to request the information that would be useful. Fuel testing, fuel quality testing is an issue which this body has addressed in the past, in fact, there was legislation enacted in, I believe, it was in 1984, to explore this. The language here would ask for sort of an update without the expenditure of additional funds, but an update to the extent that they can do that of the information that was compiled at that time. Actually, if we were to move into this in a serious way, at some time in the future I think it would inevitably require the assistance of a consultant, the expenditure of funds.
