Republican and more than one-third Catholic. Today's election is considered too close to call. A <u>San Diego Union</u> poll--five days after Maher barred Killea from taking Communion--found 72 percent disapproved his actions; 69 percent of Catholics disapproved. Killea's opponent, Republican Assemblywoman Carol Bentley," B-e-n-t-l-e-y, "supports abortions only in cases of rape, incest or life endangerment. But her campaign aide, David Lewis," L-e-w-i-s, "says, 'it was a naive move' by Maher 'if his intent was to help Carol. If Carol Bentley loses, I would lay it at the feet of the bishop.'"

PRESIDENT NICHOL PRESIDING

PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And to digress, she did lose. The one that the church sanctioned won. "Some Republicans like Lawrence Fontana, an El Cajon," C-a-j-o-n, "truck driver, plan to vote for Killea. Says Fontana, a Catholic: 'This is going to bring out Catholics who've been hiding in the woodworks.' But Mari Mlyniec," M-l-y-n-i-e-c, "a court clerk, told Killea about her two adopted children and said, 'Because their natural mother didn't take away their lives, I have two beautiful children.' Killea's response: 'How can I as a politician...tell someone who isn't a Catholic, say a Jewish person who has a different belief, what to do?'" Mr. Chairman, how much time do I have?

PRESIDENT: About seven seconds.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I can't complete it, so I will turn my light on.

PRESIDENT: All right, thank you. May I introduce some guests, please, in the south balcony.
