irresponsible, let's just point out who they are, let them take the blame, don't put it on Senator Labedz.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Hall, please.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, what are we talking about here? What is the motion in front of the Chair?

PRESIDENT: The motion is to overrule the Chair.

SENATOR HALL: Okay. That's...I've not...that's what I thought, all right. I would rise to oppose the motion to overrule the Chair because I think basically the decision by the Chair was based on whether or nor enough debate had taken place and whether or not the question could be called. Is that it? Okay. I think it was a good decision. I'm going to vote no to overrule the Chair.

PRESIDENT: Senator Pirsch, please.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Question.

PRESIDENT: You're the last speaker, that won't be necessary. So the question is, shall...Senator Chambers, did you wish to close? I'm sorry.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, Senator Lamb, when I put that...flashed that card "I like you", I meant that. I like what you said. Yesterday when we got to the end of the day and somebody made the motion to adjourn, I voted yes, let's adjourn. The majority who were voting said, no, let's not adjourn and it was on a bill about which I had been conversing for a period of time, so I resumed my discussion and people became disheartened or whatever and decided they didn't want to stay after all and then voted to go home. So it matters not to me whatever course is decided on by others. I just know what it is I've determined in my mind I'm going to do and I'm going to push through and hold fast to what I feel I must do. Senator Lamb has shown how subjective words are. That which means one thing to him means the opposite to somebody else. I'm not going to lay blame on anybody for what is happening here. That's not even necessary. What I say, Senator Lamb, is that we both have a right, each side, to do whatever we're going to do. Your side decided they wanted to bring this issue up knowing that it was going to generate what we have
