the <u>Viewpoint</u>, which is a paper published in McCall, Idaho. Headline: Women become pregnant, not oppressive governments. Women become pregnant, not oppressive governments. This is dated February 3rd, 1990. "I wish to respectfully present thoughts and reflections on abortion for your consideration. The vulgar and repugnant views of Martin Luther apparently filled the chambers of many state legislatures." And this is the quote from Martin Luther. "'If a woman grows weary and at last dies from childbearing, it matters not. Let her die from bearing. She is here to do it.' Does the state think that they own a woman's body? Hitler thought so. He often said that he admired Martin Luther more than any other German. Romania's Ceausescu thought that the state owned women's bodies and dictated to them through law. What it produced was children of tyranny, the deaths of thousands of women from illegal abortions, Europe's highest infant mortality rate, and unwanted children abandoned and loveless in harsh state-runned crphanages."
