other one. Then the playing field is level and everything goes. And then when they stick their nose in there and they get it knocked, then they can't complain and say, hey, I want to do what politicians do but I want to be treated with some kind of exemption or immunity. Can't be. I would like to be immuni...well, actually, I wouldn't. I was going to say I would like to be immunized against criticism but iron sharpens iron. If I didn't receive criticism and opposition, I'd probably grow stale and then eventually die, but that term eventually covers a period of about 80 years so I don't want any of you to get any ideas or get your hopes too high too soon. But, Senator Hall says, that is not very long ago. I am enjoying this session today more than any that I have been in since I have been down in this Legislature. I think the spirit is so cheerful. There has been such participation. The discussion has taken place on such a high level. Senator Landis's favorite word is the collegial...

SPEAKER BARRETT: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...spirit. I like this. I just kind of feel brotherhood and sisterhood oozing out of all of the pores of everybody. Something like that song about Mack, the Knife. They found a body oozing life. Well, what we are oozing is not life but kindliness which I think exemplifies what President Bush called for but quickly disregarded, and that is that kinder and gentler spirit. Senator...my good friend, Senator Lamb, has a sign over there that says, SAG. I don't know what it means but I am certainly not going to sag. I am asking on this motion that is before us today that I am discussing right now to reconsider the vote that rejected returning this bill, LB 685 (sic), for the purpose of adopting Senator Landis's very reasonable and pro...

SPEAKER BARRETT: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...I think it would be called pro-life position.

SPEAKER BARRETT: You have heard the closing on the motion to reconsider the vote which was taken earlier. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record vote has been requested. Record, please.
