occur in women who are 20 to 24 years of age; and 41 percent occur in women who are 25 or older. Eighty-one percent of these women are unmarried, 19 percent are married, and that can be in a variety of circumstances, not all of which are the friendliest or the best operating family situation. Ninety-one percent of the abortions are performed within the first 12 weeks of pregnancy, time in which the fetus is, for all intents and purposes, without feeling, without a sensation of pain, insentient, if you will. Eight percent are performed between the 13th and 20th weeks, 1 percent are performed after 21 weeks of pregnancy. Now there is a difference in the numbers per 100 as to who and who does not have abortions in this country. Out of every 100 women, 2.3 non-Hispanic white women have an abortion; 4.3 out of 100 hispanic women will have abortions; and 5.3 out of a 100 nonwhite women most of whom are black, will have abortions. Oddly enough the abortion rate is higher among Catholics than among Protestants. Catholics are more likely to obtain abortions than Jewish women. Women who profess no religion have a higher abortion rate than do women who report attending regular religious affiliations. One out of every six women who have abortions describes herself as born again or as in an Evangelical Christian set. These women are half as likely as other women to have abortions. It is critical to understand that this is a phenomenon that crosses the socio and economic boundaries as well. Women with incomes below \$11,000 who 15 percent of the population represent twice that amount, 33 percent of all abortion patients. I think it would be a disaster for the already strained resources of those women whose lives are already at the very end and very thinly stretched, who may well be caring for existing children, to be further burdened and logically they sometimes choose the painful but necessary option of abortion. Women with incomes between 11,000 and \$25,000 are 29 percent of the population and they have a slightly higher percentage, a 34 percent of all abortion patients. Women with incomes of \$25,000 or more are 56 percent of the population and they have 33 percent of the abortions. That is to say that abortion is a phenomenon far more likely of the most poverty stricken of women than it is of women with greater means. Low income women are about three times more likely to have an abortion than women who are financially better off, and is it any wonder, given the length and strength...
