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times Senator Morrissey has spoke on the return to Select File. We are up to three or four already, and he is only supposed to speak three times. She is trying to count them now. There is two or three pages.

PRESIDENT: We have changed Pages and...just a moment. I think the Clerk's secretary has it here. Senator Morrissey, you and I are in trouble.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Yes.

PRESIDENT: I am in more trouble than you are, but it is correct. We have you on the fifth time. I understand, by the official count, so...

SENATOR MORRISSEY: What, five?

PRESIDENT: Yeah, that is what they tell me?

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Is that a ruling by the Chair?

PRESIDENT: Yeah, that is my ruling by the Chair based on the honesty of this young lady down here, so I guess you will have to quit.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: I will go ahead and just quit.

PRESIDENT: Okay, thank you. Senator Labeledz, you are the next speaker. Senator Labeledz. Senator Labeledz.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Yes.

PRESIDENT: You are the next speaker. Senator Wesely. I don't see Senator Wesely. Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, we were discussing the matter of abortion and who is likely to use it in what kind of circumstances. One question one might have is why do women have abortions? The common answers are that the woman is unmarried, in an unstable relationship. She may be too young. She may see herself as being too old. She is in...

PRESIDENT: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Mr. President, point of personal privilege.
